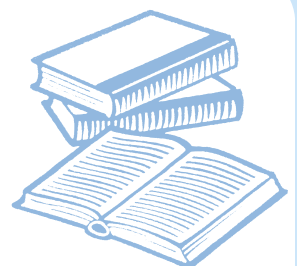

ASHLEY WALKER, PHD CANDIDATE

Ashley Walker passed her qualifying exams and is officially a PhD Candidate in Anatomical Sciences Education in the Department of Anatomy and Cell Biology at the University of Florida.



ZANA SIMS, PHD

Dr. Zana Sims has started a postdoctoral position in the Department of Integrative Anatomical Sciences at the University of Southern California, Keck School of Medicine, after successfully defending her dissertation, "Cervical Root Morphology and Diet in Extant Catarrhines: Implications for Dietary Reconstruction in Miocene Fossils," at Johns Hopkins University, School of Medicine, Center for Functional Anatomy and Evolution. Her dissertation research was funded by the Leakey Foundation.

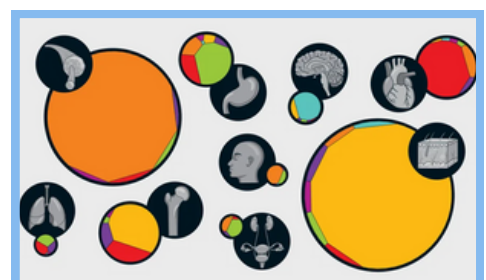

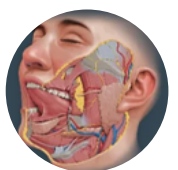
