


OCT 12TH

In our second event, we celebrated the life and academic legacy of Dr. W.M. Cobb, the first Black man to earn a PhD in physical anthropology (1932) and the first person to be named Distinguished Professor of Anatomy at Howard University (1969).

Black in Anatomy hosted a panel discussion on the ripple effect of Dr.Cobb's legacy in the fields of anthropology, anatomy, and medical illustration, including insights from his friends and family.
